The First Parliament of New South Wales

There are several notable milestones in Australia's history which have occurred in August. Going back just over 200 years to the 25th of August, 1824, the first meeting of the New South Wales Parliament was held at what is now known as **Old Government House in Parramatta, Sydney**. This was the first meeting of a legislative body in Australia. It was preceded by an Act in the United Kingdom Parliament which established the **Legislative Council**. **Sir Thomas Brisbane** (painting by F. Schenck), was the **Governor of NSW** at the time with five people appointed to the first council to advise the Governor.

The first five principal officers appointed to the Legislative Council as advisers to the Governor were Francis Forbes as Chief Justice, Frederick Goulburn as Colony Secretary, William Stewart as Lieutenant Governor, John Oxley as Surveyor-General, and James Bowman as Principal Surgeon. The first Act passed allowed for transactions to be made in unofficial currencies which were already being used, such as Spanish dollars.

In 1828, the Council moved to the **Surgeon's Wing of the General Hospital**, known as **Macquarie's "Rum Hospital"**, which forms the façade of the present-day New South Wales Parliament building. This move was needed as the Council had been expanded to include up to 15 members.

Famous Australians



Rod Laver AC MBE, was born in Rockhampton, Queensland, on 9 August 1938.

Nicknamed "Rocket" by coach Harry Hopman due to his slowness on the court, Laver is one of the greatest tennis players to have played with a long list of achievements.

He is the only player to win a Grand Slam (all four tennis major tournaments in a single year), and he did this twice. Laver was the number 1 ranked player from 1964 to 1970.

Laver won 11 major tournaments from just 16 attempts before retiring.

Respected by players and fans around the world, the Laver Cup tournament has been created in his honour.

The Sound of Music

Songs from the musical, *Sound of Music,* will be broadcast on Thursday, 21 August at 2pm (AEST) & 1.30pm (ACST)

The Sound of Music was originally a 1959 Broadway musical based on the memoir of Maria Von Trapp. The film adaptation of the musical, starring Julie Andrews and Christopher Plummer was released in 1965 and subsequently won five Academy Awards. The broadcast features the following songs – The Sound of Music, Sixteen Going on Seventeen, Climb every Mountain and Edelweiss.



Fiddler on the Roof will be the featured musical to be broadcast on the third Thursday of the month at 2pm (AEST) and 1.30pm (ACST), 18 September.

Girl Crazy will be broadcast on the third Thursday of the month at 2pm (AEST) and 3.00pm (AEDT), 16 October.
