The poem was written by Robert Burns in 1788 in Scots-language and is based on an older Scottish folk song.

The first verse of the English standard version of the song is listed below:

Should <u>old</u> acquaintance be forgot, and never brought to mind? Should <u>old</u> acquaintance be forgot, and auld lang syne?

Chorus:

For auld lang syne, my <u>dear</u>, for auld lang syne, we'll take a cup of kindness yet, for auld lang syne.

Dame Quentin Bryce was born in Brisbane on 1 December 1942 and was raised in Ilfracombe, Queensland.

In 1968, Bryce was the first woman appointed as a faculty member of the law school at University of Queensland. In 1978, she was appointed to the National Women's Advisory Council and in 1984, she became the first director of the Queensland Women's Information Service. Bryce was also appointed as the Queensland Director of the Human Rights and Equal Opportunity Commission and in 1988 became the Federal Sex Discrimination Commissioner.

Dame Quentin Bryce was Governor of Queensland (2003-08), Governor General of Australia (2008-14) and is the Patron for Silver Memories.
